The Romans in Britain

Year 3/4

Summer Term 6 - 2024



Key Areas of Learning

As **historians**, we will be finding out about the Roman's invasion of Britain. We will look at how the Roman empire grew and why they invaded Britain. We will be exploring Ancient Roman artefacts to discover what they can tell us about Roman society and how life changed in Britain after the Roman invasion. We will also be visiting The Corinium Museum later in the term where we will enhance our learning by looking at real Roman artefacts and taking part in workshops that will bring the topic to life.

As **scientists**, we will be learning about teeth and eating. We will find out about the different types of teeth that we and other animals have and the jobs they do. We will also explore how humans digest food and the organs that are involved in this process.

English

In English this term we will be writing our own stories inspired by The Mysteries of Harris Burdick. Later on, we will write explanation texts.

We will be reading The Sheep-Pig by Dick King-Smith.

Maths

This term we will be looking at:

- Time
- Shape and space
- Position and direction
- Money

We will also be practising our times tables and division facts and increasing our 'rock speed' on Times Table

RE

We will be asking the question: Can made up stories tell the truth?

Children will be exploring how Jesus taught truth through stories.

PE

The children will be developing their athletics skills this term as well as enjoying lessons in our swimming pool.

Computing

This term the children will continue to learn about coding. They will be combining their maths knowledge of position, direction and shape to build code that draws shapes.

DT

This term we will be honing our food preparation skills to design, make and evaluate a bread roll and a filling for our whole school picnic.

PSCHE

This term we will be learning about how we change as we grow and go through puberty. We will also be thinking about healthy relationships.

Music

This term we will be looking at music notation building on their understanding from key stage 1. We will be looking at reading and playing rhythms using minims, crotchets, quavers and semi quavers and using our knowledge of dynamics to create our own compositions using untuned musical instruments.

Oak class will continue to learn the guitar.

French

This term in French we are learning to describe our pets and will be exploring how adjectives work.
