Dear Parents and Carers,

Talk from Burford Headteacher on children's use of mobile phones

Thank you to all the parents who joined Mr Albrighton, headteacher of Burford School, this morning to discuss the use of mobile phones by children and young people. A letter has been sent to the families of children in Year 5 and 6 from Burford School, with a link to a survey to provide your own views on mobile phone use in secondary schools. Please do take the time to read this letter and complete the survey so your voice is heard.

Parking and Walk to School Challenge (WOW)

The business owners at the Wychwood Business Park have asked me to remind you that their carpark is private and for the use of people who are using their businesses. If you're struggling to find somewhere to park, why not use one of the village hall carparks and then walk? We call this using the Park and Stride!

Parents of children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 (Key Stage 2) have now begun our Walk to School Challenge. The children in Key Stage 2 attended a special assembly last week held by the school's Eco Council to tell them all about it and there is much excitement about the potential to earn badges throughout the year while also reaping the many benefits of having more active journeys. We hope you will take part in this pilot. If it is successful, we plan to roll it out to the rest of the school.
