KS1 Lessons and Routines

- Begin each morning with a maths activity before doing the register. Teachers also spend time reading with the children.
- Morning lessons: Phonics, Spelling, English, Maths, Whole Class Reading
- Afternoon lessons: Science, Topic (Geography/ History), RSHE, Art/DT, Music, RE, PE, Forest School.
- On Fridays, we have a special whole school celebration assembly, where each class has a star, achiever and learning hero.

Our topic questions for this year will be:

- Is the weather forecast always right? What is the oldest building in the Wychwoods? What is it like to live in Costa Rica? Can one person change the world? Do we still need maps? Who lived in castles?
- Special events will happen throughout the year. This term, we will be having an International Week as a school. KS1 will be learning about five different countries from around the world.









Lessons and learning behaviours






- Daily 30-minute sessions
- Read Write Inc. programme
- Assessed and grouped regularly
- Practising known sounds, learning new sounds, reading sounds within words, writing sounds with words, reading and discussing books

Phonics

- Children are heard reading in this session.
- Books are sent home on a Friday.



Spelling - Year 1 and 2

- All children will take part in practicing spellings, focusing on Common Exception Words ('CEWs') which are also called 'Red Words'.
- The children are familiar with 'Red Words' from Phonics and English lessons and we use the expression 'You can't Fred a Red'. Examples include the, no, friend, people.
- Children will be sent home spelling lists on a Wednesday (as appropriate) to continue practicing at home. Little and often is recommended and you can find a list of suggested spelling activities on Seesaw.
- Words are continually revisited in class and are tested regularly. We discuss how regular, repeated practice can make us successful with spelling.



Spelling - Year 2 only

- Year 2 will also be learning spelling patterns/rules, for example adding suffixes -ed, -ing. This consists of 15 minute daily taught lessons using the Read Write Inc. Spelling programme.
- The rule will be sent home on Seesaw on a Wednesday, with some example words, and the following week children have a 'speed spell' of 6 words to see if they have understood.
- Year 2s will be given a spelling logbook to record the different spelling rules and words. We will encourage them to focus on recording those they find challenging (including words incorrect on the speed spell). This comes to and from home/school in their book bag each day.
- This is consistent with KS2 spelling lessons. Mrs Gent will be running a Spelling Workshop on Spelling on Wednesday 4th October at 8.45am (approx. 30 minutes) if you would like more information about how we teach spelling and how to help at home.





Reading at school

 During the school day, there are many opportunities where adults listen to the children read. They will also read their banded book 1:1 with an adult at least fortnightly and this will be recorded on Seesaw. Further information about how we read at school has been sent home today.

Reading at home

- Children will bring home one banded reading books. We support children to become independent changing their books. We would like you to listen to your child reading this book for 10-15 minutes every day.
- Reading daily is encouraged in KS1 to foster a love of reading and books. Any reading or sharing of books that you do with your child will enhance their learning.



Library

There is a weekly library session where children can choose a book. We will be giving the school library books out in plastic wallets to help children keep them safe and help with the loaning process.

KS1 Reading Trolley

There is a KS1 reading trolley, which will be out in the morning. This is for you to use with your child so that you can have more books to choose and share in addition to the banded books. You don't need to check which books you borrow with your teacher - please be respectful and borrow a maximum of 2 books and return them before you borrow more.



PE and Forest School

- Third later Fleece or woolly jumper. Please ensure this is plain and has no logos. Our school hoodies are available to <u>buy</u> or plain green woolly jumpers/fleeces are also fine.

Bottom:

- Plain tracksuit trousers/leggings (Darker colours or one plain colour are preferable, no jeans, no patterned leggings)
- 1 pair of normal socks and 1 pair of thick socks for colder weather.
- · Named welly boots. These can stay at school.

Hometime

- If your child is going home with someone else we do need verbal or written permission, you can do this at drop off on the door or contact the office.
- You can give a letter detailing designated people that can pick up at any time or on a regular day.
