We share the poems for that current week and use it to have a discussion about the aspects of nature that feature in the poems. This overview details which areas of the curriculum are covered by sharing the nature poems.

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September (Term 1)		
Learning points covered:	Species: sandpiper, magpies, spiders, swallows,	
	Trees and plants- acorn, fern, plums, apples, oak, heather,	
	UTW concepts – morning dew, how spider's webs are made, how paper is made, bird migration, how many days in a	
	year, pips and seeds, predators, wading birds, scavenger birds, seed dispersal, habitats, harvest	
October (Term 1 and 2)		
Learning points covered:	Species: squirrels, hogs, geese, limpets, hawk, mice, hedgehogs, bats, owls.	
	Trees and plants – horse chestnut, pumpkins, truffles.	
	UTW concepts – scarecrows and their purpose, nocturnal animals, tree dwellers, endangered, predators, extinction,	
	prey, birds of prey, weather changes, storms.	
November (Term 2)		
Learning points covered:	Species: fox, quails, blackbird, sparrows, geese	
	Trees and plants: pine trees	
	UTW concepts – fog, thanksgiving, weather changing, predators, nocturnal, evergreen, migration, different types of	
	rain.	
December (Term 2)		
Learning points covered:	Species: dormouse, owls, fallow deer,	
	Trees and plants: holly, ivy	
	UTW concepts – hibernation, predators, omnivores, old wives tales, signs of winter, tides, snow, old wives tales,	
	changes from day to night.	

Term 3 and 4

January Term 3	
Learning points covered:	Species: swallow, blue tit, blackbird
	Trees and plants: Silver Birch tree
	UTW concepts – 12 months in a year, snow, translucent, features of winter, slush, short days in winter,
February Term 3	
Learning points covered:	Species: fox, sheep



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	Trees and plants: chestnut tree, snowdrops UTW concepts – thawing, signs of approaching spring, icicles, ravines, months of the year and how many days they all have, leap year.
March Term 4	
Learning points covered:	Species: cats, rabbits, ducks, wrens, crows, cows, pigeons Trees and plants: pansies, lilies, daffodils, crocuses, UTW concepts – seasons changing, spring approaching, germination of seeds, birds building nests, camouflage, different names for males and female animals. Omnivores, migration, livestock, mammals, herbivores, herd, amphibians, life cycles. Hibernation.

Term 5 and 6

April Term 4 and Term 5	
Learning points covered:	Species: pheasant, trout, woodpecker, foals and mares
	Trees and plants: primrose
	UTW concepts: April showers, rainbows, new growth, animal life cycles.
May Term 5	
Learning points covered:	Species: cockerel, badgers, ducks, caterpillars, frogs, herons
	Trees and plants: Nettles, tulips, dandelions, buttercups
	UTW concepts – May Day, the sun, full moon
June Term 6	
Learning points covered:	Species: butterflies, bees, worms, moles, snails, cats, insects, bugs
	UTW concepts – hotter weather, lighter nights, heliotropic plants, life cycles, migrating birds, nocturnal animals,
	historical names/uses for plants, the cycle of the Moon, the Sun being a star, dawn, poisonous plants, edible plants.
July Term 6	
Learning points covered:	Species: whales, moths
	Trees and plants: peas
	UTW concepts – shadows, the tide coming in and out, animals changing their shells, sunsets, darkness, the Moon,
	rivers
